## BEGGS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OKLAHOMA GIRLS TRACK & FIELD ATHLETE OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 19, 2013) — In its 28<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Regan Ward of Beggs High School as its 2012-13 Gatorade Oklahoma Girls Track & Field Athlete of the Year. The 5-foot-5 senior won three individual state titles this spring and led the Golden Demons to the Class 3A championship as a team. Ward won the 800-meter run with a time of 2:19.55, captured the 1600 in 5:12.79 and took the 3200 in 11:13.03. She also won the 1600 at the state Meet of Champions in 5:05.71.

Ward has maintained a 4.28 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has volunteered locally as a Bible class teacher and has participated in service-mission trips to assist impoverished inner-city children.

"Regan has a lot of God-given ability, but she understands that you have to put in the blood, sweat and tears," said Gerard Alexander, Beggs High head coach. "I've been coaching 26 years and there aren't too many kids who are willing to work as hard as she has."

Ward has signed a National Letter of Intent to compete in track and field and cross country on scholarship at the University of Arkansas this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
