## MADISON SOUTHERN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® KENTUCKY FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-11, 205-pound junior running back rushed for 2,621 yards and 42 touchdowns on 220 carries this past season, leading the Eagles to a 10-2 record and the Class 5A quarterfinals. A MaxPreps sophomore All-American, Harris was also the District Player of the Year and a Courier-Journal Second Team All-State selection. He is rated as the nation's No. 20 recruit in the Class of 2015 by ESPN.

Harris has maintained a B average in the classroom. A devoted member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, he has volunteered locally on behalf of youth football camps and drug awareness initiatives.

"Damien Harris is the best running back I've seen in 18 years as a head coach in Kentucky," said Mike Settles, head coach at Lincoln County High. "His combination of strength, speed and work ethic is tremendous."

Harris will begin his senior year of high school next fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
