She is a three-time First Team All-Conference selection and a 2013 Washington Post First Team All-Met honoree.

Bateman has maintained a 3.54 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church community, she has served as president of her school's chapter of Students Against Destructive Decisions and has volunteered locally at the Washington D.C. Veterans Affairs Medical Center.

"Becca Bateman's leadership has been uncanny and unmatched for our team," said St. John's College High head coach Bill Pribac. "She leads by example on and off the court."

Bateman has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on an athletic scholarship at Marymount University beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
