A 2013-14 American Volleyball Coaches Association First Team Under Armour All-American, Frantti is a two-time First Team All-State selection and is ranked No. 2 nationally in the Class of 2014 by PrepVolleyball.com.

Frantti has maintained a 3.36 GPA in the classroom. She has served as a member of her school's student council and volunteered locally on behalf of an area food pantry and as a youth volleyball coach.

"Ali Frantti has the ability to change the course of any given match," said Lisa Reddish, head coach at Crystal Lake Central High. "She has always had that ability, but she is also an awesome teammate who plays for the love of the game."

Frantti has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on an athletic scholarship at Penn State University beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
