ELKHART CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® INDIANA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

An Under Armour Second Team All-American as named by the American Volleyball Coaches Association, Stahl recorded a .573 hitting percentage and .679 kill percentage. A two-time First Team All-State selection as named by the Indiana Coaches of Girls Sports Association, she made the 2012 USA Women's Junior National Team.

Stahl has maintained a 3.40 weighted GPA in the classroom. She has donated her time to mentoring students with special physical, emotional and social needs through physical activity.

"Azariah Stahl is not only an all-around great player, but she excels at teamwork," said Angie Hardman, head coach at rival Adams High. "She by far is the best player on her team, and I would go as far as to say definitively the best player in the state. She shows great control, consistency and precise decision-making with each play. She is a player that stands out above the rest. The best part about her, though, is the fact that she is all about the team. She is an excellent role model and example of what volleyball players around the state of Indiana should look like. I would take 12 of her on my team."

Stahl has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on scholarship at Purdue University beginning in the fall of 2014

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
