EAGAN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MINNESOTA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

McNeil recorded 563 kills, 337 digs, 56 blocks while compiling a .502 kill percentage. A four-time First Team All-State selection and a 2013-14 First Team Under Armour All-American as named by the American Volleyball Coaches Association, she is ranked No. 46 nationally in the Class of 2014 by PrepVolleyball.com.

McNeil has maintained a 3.63 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a youth volleyball coach and at an area hospital with career aspirations of becoming a nurse.

"Taylr McNeil is a terrific volleyball player and a great athlete," said Smoak Vitek, head coach at Rosemount High.
"When she was on her game she was difficult to stop. She also consistently demonstrated good leadership on the court."

McNeil has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on an athletic scholarship at the University of South Carolina beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

McNeil joins recent Gatorade Minnesota Volleyball Players of the Year Sarah Wilhite (2012-2013 & 2011-12, Eden Prairie High School), Kellie McNeil (2010-11, Lakeville North High School), Ashley Wittman (2009-10 & 2008-09, Shakopee), and Jennifer Lopez (2007-08, DGF) among the state's list of former award winners.
