SANDIA HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW MEXICO VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Carroll recorded 343 kills, 221 digs, 108 blocks and 10 service aces while posting a hitting percentage of .363 and a kill percentage of .478. A two-time Albuquerque Journal First Team All-Metro selection, she is a three-time All-District 5-5A First Team pick.

Carroll has maintained a 3.66 GPA in the classroom. A member of Sandia High's Continentals singing group, she has volunteered locally with her school's Key Club and National Honor Society.

"Amanda Carroll is a dominant player and I can safely say that I doubt Sandia could have won without her," said Al Rosen, head coach of Gadsden High. "Her jumping ability and explosive attacking skills make her very difficult to defend."

Carroll will begin her senior year of high school in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
