WAKEFIELD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NORTH CAROLINA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Mack has maintained a 3.37 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally at an area soup kitchen and on behalf of Susan G. Komen for the Cure, the U.S. Marine Corps Toys for Tots Foundation and as part of an elementary education literacy outreach program.

"Darian Mack is a natural at the sport of volleyball," said Traci Smith, head coach at Broughton High. "She is a very dynamic player, an outstanding athlete, she's humble and has an amazing attitude. She engages with younger players as well as opponents in a positive fashion."

Mack has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on an athletic scholarship at the University of Kentucky beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
