BISHOP KELLEY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® OKLAHOMA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A two-time First Team All-State selection, Gandall is a 2013-14 Honorable Mention Under Armour All-American as named by the American Volleyball Coaches Association, and was the 2013 Tulsa World Metro Player of the Year.

Gandall has maintained a 3.89 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church parish community, she has volunteered locally on behalf of multiple community service initiatives in association with the National Honor Society.

"Josie Gandall is a very athletic, talented player in every area of the game," said Will Ethridge, head coach at Edmond Santa Fe High. "She is an extremely strong passer, hitter, blocker and server. She is the type of player who will make you change your game."

Gandall has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on an athletic scholarship at St. Louis University beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
