## STATE COLLEGE AREA HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® PENNSYLVANIA VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

A two-time All-State selection, Leath was ranked as the No. 90 Senior Ace in the country by PrepVolleyball.com.

Leath has maintained a 3.95 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics, youth volleyball camps and a community-inclusion program for students with developmental disabilities.

"She has a great all-around game," said Mike Krause, head coach at Parkland High. "She anticipates well, she varies her swing and she has great presence blocking. She can dominate a game."

Leath has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on an athletic scholarship at the University of North Carolina beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
