MENOMONEE FALLS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® WISCONSIN VOLLEYBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

She was a member of the 2012 U.S. Women's Junior National Team and the 2013 USA Volleyball Girls' Youth National Team.

Lee has maintained a 3.41 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of the Christ the King Baptist Church Community, she has volunteered locally as a peer tutor and youth volleyball coach. She has also participated in the Falls/Sussex Youth Leadership program with a mission of inspiring community trusteeship in area youth.

"Simone Lee is a natural leader who leads by example in both practice and in matches," said Menomonee head coach J.C. Bruns. "In spite of all the accolades she has received, she has let none of it go to her head. She is still the down-to-earth teammate she has always been. She loves playing with her teammates and they love playing with her."

Lee has signed a National Letter of Intent to play volleyball on an athletic scholarship at Penn State University beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
