## FORT MYERS HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE FLORIDA GIRLS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

Edwards also won the Southwest Florida Invitational, the District 11 championship, the Region 3 title and the Lee County Athletic Conference crown. She finished second at the FSU Pre-State Invitational and the flrunners.com Invitational.

Edwards has maintained a perfect 4.0 GPA in the classroom. Also a talented musician, she has volunteered locally on behalf of youth running programs, and has raised funds to benefit cancer and leukemia research.

"Emily is currently running at a high level," said Fort Myers head coach Kelly Heinzman-Britton. "She's also proven to be a great leader, on and off the course. She's just an extraordinary young lady, and without a doubt, one of the school's best all-around students."

Edwards has verbally committed to an athletic scholarship at the University of Alabama beginning in the fall of 2014.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
