## STRAKE JESUIT COLLEGE PREPARATORY STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE TEXAS BOYS CROSS COUNTRY RUNNER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (January 16, 2014) — In its 29<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Frank Lara of Strake Jesuit College Preparatory as its 2013-14 Gatorade Texas Boys Cross Country Runner of the Year. The 5-foot-7, 120-pound senior raced to the Class 5A individual state championship this past season with a time of 15:26.25. Lara finished second at the Nike Cross Nationals South Regional championships in 15:31.67, and took ninth at the Foot Locker South Regional championships. He earned victories at the District Championships, the San Jacinto Battleground Invitational and the Jesuit Invitational.

Lara has maintained a 3.89 GPA in the classroom. Also a talented musician, he is a member of the school's Athletes in Action service club and has organized visits to the cancer center at Texas Children's Hospital.

"Frank is one of the most disciplined athletes I have coached in 35 years," said Strake Jesuit coach Mike Kerley. "He's been a wonderful mentor to the younger athletes on our team."

Lara remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Lara joins Gatorade Texas Boys Cross Country Runners of the Year Robert Domanic (2012-13, Hebron High School), Craig Nowak (2011-12, Cypress Woods High School), Craig Lutz (2010-11 & 2009-10, Marcus High School), Reed Connor (2008-09, The Woodlands), and Colby Lowe (2007-08, Southlake Carroll) as athletes who have won the cross country award since its inception in 2007.
