GEORGETOWN VISITATION PREPARATORY SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-6 senior midfielder scored 22 goals and passed for six assists this past season, leading the Sharks (7-7-2) to the Independent School League tournament quarterfinals. Kulik was a First Team All-ISL selection and a Washington Post Second Team All-Met honoree. She concluded her prep soccer career with 66 goals and 26 assists.

Kulik has maintained a 3.67 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally with Georgetown Visitation's Key Club as well as the Think Pink organization and has donated her time to a homeless shelter and food bank.

"Maddie Kulik carried her team," said Ross McEwen, head coach of Potomac School. "Maddie was a threat all over the field, played hard for 80 minutes, scored goals to prove her talent, and Visitation wouldn't have been successful without her on the field."

Kulik remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
