## SUTTON HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MASSACHUSETTS GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Goulet scored 10 goals, passed for five assists and anchored a defense that recorded 11 shutouts. A Worcester Telegram & Gazette Girls Soccer Super Team All-Star and a Division 4 All-State honoree, she scored both goals for Sutton in a 2-1 win over Austin Prep in the state title match.

Goulet has maintained an A average in the classroom. A participant at the 2013 MIAA Sportsmanship Summit, she has volunteered locally with Kicks for Cancer and as a youth soccer coach.

"Eve Goulet was a constant presence this year," said Jarred Stand, head coach of Douglas High. "She has good size, speed and vision. Along with her physical attributes, she is a hard-working player who competes for the full 80 minutes. I look forward to watching her play the next two years, but I do not look forward to coaching against her."

Goulet has made a verbal commitment to attend Northeastern University beginning in the fall of 2015.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
