## CENTRAL VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE WASHINGTON GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Turnbow scored 20 goals and passed for one assist despite missing six games while training with the U.S. Soccer Under-14 Girls National Team. A Second Team Class 4A All-State selection by the Washington State Soccer Coaches Association, she is the ranked as the nation's No. 48 prospect in the Class of 2017 by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

Turnbow has maintained a 3.94 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach.

"Kelsey Turnbow will be a force for years to come," said Roland Minder, head coach of Camas High. "We could not handle her combination play up top. She has the whole package: reads the game, skill, pace, nose for the goal. She is a true forward."

Turnbow will begin her sophomore year of high school next fall.
