ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE IDAHO BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-9, 142-pound senior forward and midfielder scored 25 goals and passed for 10 assists this past season, leading the Grizzlies to a 9-10-1 record. The 2013 Idaho Soccer Coaches Association Player of the Year, Fox is a member of the U.S. Youth Soccer Region IV Olympic Development Program team and a three-time First Team Class 5A All-Southern Idaho Conference selection. He concluded his prep soccer career with 65 goals and 25 assists.

Fox has maintained a 3.85 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a certified nursing assistant, a pharmacist technician and as a youth soccer coach.

"Tyson Fox had a fantastic year even with a very incomplete supporting cast," said Jayson Transtrum, head coach of Borah High. "In our senior All-Star game this year against the best seniors in the valley, he scored three goals and was the best player on the field."

Fox remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
