TRINITY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE KENTUCKY BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-5, 145-pound junior midfielder scored 16 goals and passed for 15 assists this past season, leading the Shamrocks (21-3-1) to the state championship game. An All-Region IV selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Stockton was a First Team All-State honoree and a member of the U.S. Youth Soccer Region II Olympic Development Program team. He concluded his junior year with career totals of 27 goals and 66 assists.

Stockton has maintained an A average in the classroom. A devoted member of his church community, Stockton has volunteered locally with the Kosair Children's Hospital Foundation and as a member of the Trinity Ambassador program.

"The best kid was Sam Stockton," said Rob Zoeller, head coach at Ballard High. "He is a very good soccer player and was a key piece for Trinity. I love watching him play."

Stockton will begin his senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
