## NORTH HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MINNESOTA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 13, 2014) — In its 29<sup>th</sup> year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Justin Oliver of North High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade Minnesota Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-9, 155-pound senior forward scored 39 goals and passed for 18 assists this past season, leading the Polars (21-1) to the Class 2A state championship. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Oliver was also named Class 2A Mr. Soccer and the Pioneer Press co-Player of the Year.

Oliver has maintained a 3.45 GPA in the classroom. Also a hockey standout, he helped establish a soccer program in the local elementary school system and has volunteered on behalf of the Special Olympics.

"Oliver does a great job of finding the holes and knowing where to exploit a team," said Scott Gustafson, head coach at Eastview High. "He's the kind of player you love to have on your team and hate to play against. He was the most influential player on the field."

Oliver has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Eastern Illinois University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
