SCOTCH PLAINS-FANWOOD HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW JERSEY BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (February 13, 2014) — In its 29th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced James Murphy of Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade New Jersey Boys Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-10, 155-pound sophomore midfielder scored 22 goals and passed for 17 assists this past season, leading the Raiders (18-3-1) to the North 2, Group 4 semifinals. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Murphy was the Courier News Player of the Year and a Newark Star-Ledger First Team All-State honoree. He concluded his sophomore year with career totals of 27 goals and 29 assists.

Murphy has maintained a B average in the classroom. A member of his high school's Student Athlete Leadership Team, he has volunteered locally with Special Olympics and as a youth basketball coach.

"Scotch Plains' success runs through James Murphy," said Eric Shaw, head coach of Westfield High. "Playing in the middle of the park allowed him to be the general. With very good vision and great technical ability, James was always dangerous."

Murphy will begin his junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
