CARLE PLACE HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE NEW YORK BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-8, 130-pound senior forward scored 13 goals and passed for 18 assists this past season, leading the Frogs (18-0-1) to the Class B state championship. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Klein is a two-time All-State honoree and was also chosen as the Long Island Player of the Year.

Klein has maintained an A average in the classroom. A member of Students Against Destructive Decisions and the National Honor Society, he has volunteered locally on behalf of youth soccer teams.

"Klein is a very talented player," said Paul Cutter, head coach at Garden City High. "He's extremely fast, has great acceleration, very versatile and good with both feet. He has a great ability to create chances from a wide range of areas, and he was very dangerous every time he was on the ball."

Klein has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Hofstra University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
