## SIOUX FALLS CHRISTIAN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE SOUTH DAKOTA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The Soccer605.com Small Program Boys Soccer Player of the Year, Wynja was a First Team All-State selection by the South Dakota Soccer Association. He concluded his junior year with career totals of 43 goals and 18 assists.

Wynja has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A member of the school band, he has volunteered locally at Children's Care Hospital & School and as part of multiple community-service initiatives in association with his church youth group.

"Lee Wynja did everything for his team," said Mike Grossman, head coach of O'Gorman High. "They graduated 11-12 good players from their team the year before and Lee did everything for them and they kept winning."

Wynja will begin his senior year of high school this fall.
