The 6-foot-4 junior forward and center led the Stingarees to a 31-1 record and the Class 8A state championship this past season. A returning Class 8A First Team All-State selection as named by the Florida Association of Basketball Coaches, Mompremier averaged 14.5 points, 15.5 rebounds, 3.9 assists, 3.7 blocks and 2.0 steals per game. She collected 13 points, 15 rebounds, three blocks and two steals in a 49-33, title-clinching win over Treasure Coast, capturing Class 8A state title game Most Valuable Player honors.

Mompremier has maintained a B average in the classroom. In addition to donating her time as a youth basketball instructor and scorekeeper, she has volunteered with her school's special education program and on behalf of Key Club International.

"She has displayed the qualities that this prestigious award has always stood for," said Ray Thompson, head coach of rival Dr. Krop High. "Every year, her skills have grown stronger. She's able to attack the basket, put the ball down on the floor and make a strong post move. She's just an outstanding player."

Mompremier will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
