The 6-foot-3 junior forward averaged 21.1 points, 15.8 rebounds, 7.1 assists, 3.2 steals and 3.0 blocks per game this past season, leading the Jaguars (17-2) to the Class 4A South Region semifinals. Boykin recorded 17 double-doubles in 19 games, including four games with at least 20 points and 20 rebounds. A member of Team USA's gold medal squad at the 2013 FIBA Americas U16 Championships for Women, she is ranked as the nation's No. 8 recruit in the Class of 2015 by ESPN.

Boykin has maintained a B average in the classroom. She has volunteered locally at the Glenarden-Ardmore-Springdale Boys & Girls Club and as an elementary school tutor. She also devotes much of her time to on-going support for her visually impaired younger brother.

"De'Janae Boykin is one of the best all-around players I've seen and coached against in the past 17 years," said Keith Devoe, head coach of DuVal High. "She is a very unselfish player looking to get all her teammates involved with the ability to take over a game at any time."

Boykin will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
