The returning Gatorade Player of the Year, the 5-foot-11 senior center has led the Skippers to a 19-2 record and a berth in the Division I state quarterfinals, scheduled for March 15. At the time of her selection, Buckley was averaging 15.5 points, 11.9 rebounds, 2.1 blocks and 1.5 steals per game. A two-time First Team All-State selection by the Rhode Island Coaches Association, she led all of Division I in scoring, rebounding and blocked shots during the 2012-13 season as a student at Exeter/West Greenwich High.

Buckley has maintained an A average in the classroom. A junior member of the Prudence Island Volunteer Fire Department, she has completed a mission trip to Belize, and has donated her time locally to the Providence Rescue Mission and as a youth basketball coach.

"Taylor's presence in the paint for our team this year and her offensive mindset to rebound the ball and score is second to none," said Bob Simeone, head coach of North Kingstown High. "She is a defensive presence as she controls the boards. Her love for the game and drive to succeed is a coach's dream."

Buckley has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Cedarville University in Ohio this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Two time winner Buckley joins Gatorade Rhode Island Girls Basketball Players of the Year Kailey Fugere (2011-12, Woonsocket High School), Kelly Mannix (2010-11, Barrington High School), Allie Jones (2009-10, South Kingstown), Torey Jones (2008-09, La Salle Academy), Brittany Wilson (2007-08, St. Mary Academy-Bay View), and Meredith Ward (2006-07, Westerly) among the state's list of former award winners.
