The 6-foot-5 senior center led the Highlanders to a 23-4 record and the South Carolina Independent Schools Association Class AAA state championship this past season. The National Player of the Year as named by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association and the Atlanta Tipoff Club's Naismith Girls High School Player of the Year, Wilson averaged 34.4 points, 14.5 rebounds, 5.4 blocks, 3.2 steals and 2.3 assists per game. A McDonald's High School All-American Game selection and also a WBCA All-American, she amassed 37 points, 14 rebounds and eight blocks in the 66-58, title-clinching overtime victory against Northwood Academy.

Wilson has maintained a B average in the classroom as an upperclassman and has served as a member of her school's student government and honor council. In addition to donating her time as a youth basketball and volleyball instructor, she has volunteered locally on behalf of her church and as part of an elementary school after-school care program.

"She has improved her game from year to year," said Roshan Myers, head coach of rival Hammond School. "She is by far the most dominating player my team has faced. Also, her national status has caused young aspiring basketball players to flock to her from all over the state. She responds to them with true sportsmanship, signing autographs, giving hugs and taking pictures. Through it all, she appears to remain humble. What an awesome young lady."

Wilson remains undecided upon a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
