MONROE CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ALASKA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Bynum is averaging 14.3 points, 6.4 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 2.0 steals per game entering the state playoffs. The Class 3A Player of the Year, he is a two-time First Team All-State selection.

Bynum has maintained a 3.18 GPA in the classroom. A member of the National Honor Society and a tutor in his school, he has assisted in a first-grade classroom and has volunteered preparing meals for the needy.

"He's a phenomenal athlete and a really tough point guard," said Ryan Engebretsen, head coach at Wasilla High. "He makes shots, handles the ball and he's the best defensive player in the state. He can step into any role and he has all the intangibles."

Bynum has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at Arizona Western College this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
