NORTH LITTLE ROCK HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® ARKANSAS BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Allen averaged 21.3 points, 6.4 rebounds, 4.2 assists and 3.7 steals per game. An All-Arkansas First Team selection and the state's Sophomore of the Year in 2013, he is rated as the nation's No. 27 recruit in the Class of 2015 by ESPN.

Allen has maintained a 3.19 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of youth basketball teams and the Shop With a Cop program, which provides Christmas gifts for families in need.

"Kevaughn Allen is on another level," said Searcy High coach Jimmy Summers. "He's got great athleticism, and he's really special in how smooth he plays. The game slows down for him and he makes all the right decisions."

Allen will begin his senior year of high school this fall.
