The Clarion-Ledger Metro Player of the Year and Mississippi's Mr. Basketball in 2013, he is rated as the nation's No. 1 recruit in the Class of 2015 by Rivals.com. Newman also played for USA Basketball's Men's U16 National Team and was named MVP of the FIBA Americas Championship.

Newman has maintained a B average in the classroom. A devoted member of his church community, he has volunteered locally on behalf of a youth-mentoring program, a "Don't Text and Drive" campaign and youth basketball clinics.

"Newman is one of the most talented kids I've ever seen play," said Randy Bolden, head coach at Meridian High. "He's very athletic and creative, but it's his ability to make his teammates better that makes him special. He adds another dimension to his game every year."

Newman will begin his senior year of high school this fall.
