VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEW MEXICO BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot, 190-pound senior point guard led the Vikings to a 27-2 record and the Class A state title this past season. Saltes averaged 20.4 points, 3.4 rebounds and 3.2 assists while shooting 65 percent from inside the arc this past season. A two-time first team All-State selection, he scored a game-high 26 points in Valley's 56-42 win over Atrisco Heritage.

Saltes has maintained a 3.08 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics and as a youth basketball coach.

"Adonis Saltes is an outstanding player," said Frank Castillo, head coach at La Cueva High. "He led them to the No. 1 seed and the state title this season. He is a great leader."

Saltes remains undecided on a collegiate destination.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
