Show averaged 17.7 points, 4.8 rebounds, 4.6 assists and 2.4 steals per game. A First Team All-State selection, he is a three-time First Team All-Lackawanna League honoree.

Show has maintained a 3.88 GPA in the classroom and represents one of the state's top academic candidates in meeting the Gatorade Award's broad criteria. A devoted member of his church community and a member of the National Honor Society, he has volunteered locally assisting autistic students in his school and coaching youth basketball players.

"J.C. Show is terrific," said Andrew Kettel, head coach at Scranton Prep. "He's strong, tough to guard and has a very high IQ. He can take it to the basket, set up his teammates ... he just knows how to win."

Show has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Bucknell University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
