HURON HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® SOUTH DAKOTA BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-7, 210-pound senior forward has led the Tigers to a 21-1 record and a berth in the Class AA state quarterfinals against Lincoln, scheduled for March 20. An All-State and All-Conference selection as a junior, Decker is averaging 15.2 points, 8.4 rebounds and 1.4 steals per game entering the state tournament.

Decker has maintained a 3.41 GPA in the classroom. A peer mentor in his school, he has volunteered locally on behalf of youth sports programs and an area day camp.

"Decker has the whole package," said Brent Norberg, head coach at Aberdeen Central. "He can bury you in the post, but he's really good facing up to the basket too. He's a good rebounder and passer, and he does so much for his team on defense."

Decker has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at the University of South Dakota this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
