## LONE PEAK HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® UTAH BOYS BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-4, 170-pound senior guard led the Knights to a 22-3 record and their fourth consecutive Class 5A state title this past season. Haws averaged 25.2 points, 5.2 assists, 3.5 rebounds and 1.8 steals per game. A three-time First Team All-State selection, he was also named MVP of the Class 5A state tournament for the second time.

Haws has maintained a 3.98 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of his church community, he has volunteered locally on behalf of the I Won't Cheat Foundation and youth basketball programs.

"Great players step up in big games, and Haws had some remarkable games," said Doug Meacham, head coach at American Fork High. "He's an unbelievable scorer. He can make the three or drive past you or shoot off the dribble, and he became a good passer too."

Haws has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball on scholarship at Brigham Young University after serving a two-year mission with the LDS church.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
