GRISSOM HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALABAMA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 6-foot-2, 165-pound senior defender scored seven goals and passed for six assists this past season, leading the Tigers (18-8) to the second round of the Class 6A state tournament. Rufe is a three-time Huntsville Times All-Metro selection and plays for the U.S. Youth Soccer Region II Olympic Development Program team.

Rufe has maintained a weighted 4.21 GPA in the classroom. A member of the Grissom High Spanish National Honor Society, he has volunteered locally at a food bank and homeless shelter and completed a service-mission trip to the Ukraine.

"Jake Rufe was the sole reason Grissom had a successful season," said Uwe Spiller, head coach of Bob Jones High. "His speed and technique with the ball are unmatched in the state. He has great vision and his offensive decision-making and defensive decision-making are excellent."

Rufe has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Indiana University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
