LUSHER CHARTER SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE LOUISANA BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-11, 155-pound senior forward scored 46 goals and passed for 23 assists this past season, leading the Lions (20-5) to the Division 3 state championship. A three-time First Team All-State selection, Malinich was named Division 3 MVP by the Louisiana High School Soccer Coaches Association. The Most Outstanding Player in the state championship game, he was also chosen co-Player of the Year by LAprepSoccer.net.

Malinich has maintained a 4.18 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of his church community and a tutor in his school, he has volunteered locally on behalf of hurricane relief efforts and a Vacation Bible School.

"Malinich is a fantastic player, very dynamic," said Nick Chetta, head coach at Northlake Christian High. "He's a complete player. He's got size, speed and he's very technical. Very smart too, and a great goal scorer."

Malinich has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at North Carolina State University this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with <u>USA TODAY High School Sports</u>, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
