## MADISON CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MISSISSIPPI BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Brohaugh scored 18 goals and passed for seven assists. The 2014 Class 6A state championship game MVP after scoring two goals in a 3-0 victory over Brandon High, he was a Clarion-Ledger Second Team All-State selection.

Brohaugh has maintained an A average in the classroom. A member of the Madison Central High Homecoming Court, he has volunteered locally with US Youth Soccer TOPSoccer program serving young athletes with disabilities. He has also donated his time to multiple community service initiatives in association with his church youth group.

"Ridge Brohaugh's work rate is outstanding and he has great vision," said Kenny White, Brohaugh's club coach with the Mississippi Fire Juniors. "He can strike the ball very well and he is an accurate passer over short and long distances."

Brohaugh will begin his junior year of high school this fall.
