FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE TENNESSEE BOYS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-11, 175-pound senior defender has led the Rebels to a 13-0 record entering the Region 6-AAA Tournament semifinals against Antioch High, scheduled for May 13. Ross scored two goals, passed for one assist and anchored a defense that recorded 11 shutouts in 13 games. A 2013 All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Ross is the District 11-AAA Player of the Year and a two-time First Team All-State honoree.

Ross has maintained a weighted 3.90 GPA in the classroom. He has volunteered locally as a peer math tutor and as a youth soccer coach.

"Brad Ross is commanding, strong in the air and distributes the ball well," said Giles Cheevers, head coach of Montgomery Bell Academy. "He is an excellent communicator and leader on the field. He anticipates and reads the game well and he's also very good in the tackle and strong in the air."

Ross will attend the College of Holy Cross in Worcester, Mass., where he will play soccer this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
