BRIARWOOD CHRISTIAN SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE ALABAMA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-11 senior midfielder scored 40 goals and passed for 18 assists this past season, leading the Lions (14-5-1) to the Class 5A state quarterfinals. A two-time Birmingham News All-Metro First Team selection, she recorded eight hat tricks, including six goals in a 7-2 win over Benjamin Russell High in the first round of the state tournament.

Day has maintained an A average in the classroom. The secretary of the Briarwood Christian School senior class, she has volunteered locally as part of a fundraising campaign to benefit cancer research and as a youth soccer coach.

"Claudia is as complete a player as you will see in high school soccer," said Ryan Leib, head coach of Briarwood Christian. "She is good with her feet, has great vision with her passes, can score goals, can set up goals and is great in the air."

Day has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at Wake Forest University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
