## ROCK CANYON HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE COLORADO GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-7 senior midfielder scored 13 goals and passed for nine assists this past season, leading the Jaguars (16-2) to the Class 5A state quarterfinals. A 2013 First Team All-State selection, Young is a two-time First Team All-Continental League honoree. She concluded her prep soccer career with 45 goals.

Young has maintained a 3.83 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a youth soccer coach and has served as an elementary school teacher's aide. She's also donated her time at a treatment center for underprivileged and abused children.

"Kaycie has a commanding presence on the field that is intimidating to opposing teams but yet calming to her teammates," said Danny Main, head coach of Highlands Ranch High. "She controls the tempo of the game very well, and her movement off the ball is precise to make easy passing lanes for her teammates."

Young has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on an athletic scholarship at the University of Portland this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
