CAESAR RODNEY HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE DELAWARE GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10 senior forward has led the Riders to a 12-3 record entering the Division I state tournament, scheduled to begin May 20. The state's returning Gatorade Girls Soccer Player of the Year, Prillaman scored 33 goals and passed for 14 assists in the regular season. An All-American selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, she is also a two-time First Team All-State honoree and a two-time Henlopen Conference Player of the Year.

Prillaman has maintained an A average in the classroom. Also a basketball and field hockey standout, she has volunteered locally on behalf of environmental-preservation initiatives, a soup kitchen, the Special Olympics and the U.S. Youth Soccer TOPSoccer program serving young athletes with disabilities.

"She has a good understanding of the game and a motor that never quits," said Keith Short, head coach at Milford High.
"Her determination sets her apart from anyone else we've played."

Prillaman has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Richmond this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
