BEN FRANKLIN HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE LOUISIANA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-2 sophomore forward scored 44 goals and passed for eight assists this past season, leading the Falcons (20-0) to the Division II state championship. A two-time First Team All-State selection, Thomas was chosen Division II Player of the Year by the Louisiana High School Soccer Coaches Association and was named All-Metro Offensive Player of the Year by the Times-Picayune.

Thomas has maintained a 3.98 GPA in the classroom. An English and Latin tutor in her school, she has volunteered locally on behalf of a nursing home and youth sports programs.

"Thomas is very quick, very explosive," said Al Silvis, head coach at Dominican High. "She sees the field very well and technically she's very good on the ball. She's able to get behind most defenses and whenever they need a goal, she's the one they lean on."

Thomas will begin her junior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
