WEST JONES HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE MISSISSIPPI GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-2 senior midfielder scored 30 goals and passed for 38 assists this past season, leading the Mustangs (20-2-1) to the Class 5A state championship. An All-Region selection by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America, Coleman is a two-time First Team All-State selection and was named Miss Soccer by the Clarion-Ledger.

Coleman has maintained a 4.0 GPA in the classroom. A devoted member of her church's youth group and a tutor in her school, she has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics, youth soccer programs, blood-donation drives and the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life.

"Beth Coleman is an awesome soccer player," said Rick Sager, head coach at Laurel High. "She's lightning fast, with good skills, and she's a real competitor."

Coleman has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at the University of Southern Mississippi this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
