UNION HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE OKLAHOMA GIRLS SOCCER PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (May 20, 2014) — In its 29th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Anna Beffer of Union High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade Oklahoma Girls Soccer Player of the Year. The 5-foot-4 senior midfielder scored 9 goals and passed for seven assists this past season, leading the Redskins (15-1) to the Class 6A semifinals. A three-time All-Conference and All-District selection, Beffer was MVP of the Heart of America Classic.

Beffer has maintained a 3.95 GPA in the classroom. A member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, she has volunteered locally on behalf of her church youth group and children's soccer programs.

"I think what makes her so dangerous is her ability to read the game and her vision to find the player who needs the ball," said David Cosby, head coach at Broken Arrow High. "She commands the middle and distributes the ball extremely well."

Beffer has signed a National Letter of Intent to play soccer on scholarship at Oklahoma State University this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
