Skoug is the third Gatorade Illinois Baseball Player of the Year to be chosen from Libertyville High School.

The 5-foot-11, 200-pound senior catcher owned a .482 batting average for the Wildcats (27-5) at the time of his selection. In 32 games, Skoug slugged four home runs and collected 36 RBI while compiling an on-base percentage of .572. A Perfect Game Preseason High School Second Team All-America honoree, he earned First Team All-State recognition as a junior.

Skoug has maintained a 3.85 GPA in the classroom. Also a talented musician and a devoted member of his church youth group, he has volunteered locally on behalf of a homeless shelter, youth sports programs and Feed My Starving Children. He has also completed a service-mission trip to a South Dakota Native American reservation.

"Skoug is a difference-maker on both offense and defense," said Ray Del Fava, head coach at Lake Forest High. "You have to pitch to him very carefully, and he's a great leader for his team. On defense, he calls a great game, he receives the ball very well, and he just shut down our running game."

Skoug has signed a National Letter of Intent to play baseball on scholarship at Texas Christian University this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with <u>USA TODAY High School Sports</u>, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
