At the time of his selection, Riley owned an 8-3 record with a 1.51 ERA and 79 strikeouts in 60.3 innings pitched. A 2013 First Team All-State selection, he also batted .472 with nine home runs, 34 RBI, an .824 slugging percentage and a .577 on-base percentage through 37 games.

Riley has maintained a 3.36 GPA in the classroom. A member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, he has volunteered locally on behalf of the Special Olympics and as a youth baseball coach."

"Austin Riley is a very well-rounded athlete," said David Lara, head coach at Hernando High. "He has power at the plate and can be a very dominant pitcher. I can say without reservation that he is very high quality young man."

Riley has verbally committed to play baseball on an athletic scholarship at Mississippi State University beginning in the fall of 2015.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
