CENTENNIAL HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® NEVADA BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10, 160-pound senior left-handed pitcher and outfielder led the Bulldogs to a 26-11 record and the Division I semifinals, scheduled for May 23. At the time of his selection, Powell owned a 9-1 record with a 2.95 ERA and 78 strikeouts in 73 innings. A two-time First Team All-State selection, he also batted .414 with 25 runs scored, 21 RBI and a .574 slugging percentage through 38 games.

Powell has maintained a 3.92 GPA in the classroom. A member of his school's Calculus Club, he has volunteered locally as a concession-stand worker, a youth baseball coach and on behalf of the Miracle League.

"Cooper Powell has become one of the greatest competitors I have had the opportunity to coach," said Centennial High head coach Charles Cerrone. "He is the unquestioned leader of our team. He not only performs at a high level, but he also has the ability to help raise the level of play of the players around him."

Powell will attend the University of Nevada, where he will play baseball this fall.

The <u>Gatorade Player of the Year</u> program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with <u>USA TODAY High School Sports</u>, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
