## ST. THOMAS AQUINAS HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® FLORIDA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 5, 2014) — In its 29th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Meghan King of St. Thomas Aquinas High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade Florida Softball Player of the Year. King is the third Gatorade Florida Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from St. Thomas Aquinas High School.

The 5-foot-10 senior left-handed pitcher posted a 20-2 record in the circle along with a 0.25 ERA this past season, leading the Raiders (30-2) to a second-straight Class 7A state championship. King struck out 226 batters and walked 19 in 142.2 innings pitched. The 2014 Class 7A State Player of the Year recorded 15 shutouts and three no-hitters, including one perfect game, and held opponents to a .111 batting average. She fired a one-hitter with 12 strikeouts in a 1-0 win over Harmony High in the Class 7A state title game.

King has maintained a weighted 3.99 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally as a leader at Vacation Bible Camp, as a youth softball coach and as part of multiple community-service initiatives with her church youth group.

"Meghan King is the main reason St. Thomas Aquinas beat Harmony and won the state championship," said Mark Schusterman, head coach of Gulliver Prep. "The important thing to remember is that St. Thomas played the toughest competition around and Meghan kept them in every game."

King has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on an athletic scholarship at the University of Maryland this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with <a href="USA TODAY High School Sports">USA TODAY High School Sports</a>, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.
