## DALLAS CENTER-GRIMES HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® IOWA SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

The 5-foot-10 senior left-handed pitcher and first baseman led the Mustangs (38-5) to the Class 4A state championship this past season. Lowary posted a 27-2 record with a 1.21 ERA and 244 strikeouts in 191 innings pitched. The state's returning Gatorade Softball Player of the Year, she also batted .424 with five home runs, 24 RBI, a .661 slugging percentage and a .510 on-base percentage.

Lowary has maintained a 3.97 GPA in the classroom. A devoted parishioner in her church community, she has volunteered locally on behalf of Meals from the Heartland, the Dallas County CROP Hunger Walk and as a youth softball coach.

"Paige Lowary is the complete package," said Dallas Center-Grimes head coach Steve Schlafke. "On the mound she has been dominant at the varsity level, starting with her eighth grade season throwing in the mid-60s along with changing speeds and great movement. She has persevered through hard work, dedication and a competitive spirit."

Lowary has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on an athletic scholarship at the University of Missouri this
