The 5-foot-7 junior right-handed pitcher led the Cougars to a 34-4 record and a second consecutive Class 4A state championship this past season. Named the state's 2014 Miss Softball by The Clarion-Ledger, Bishop compiled a 21-0 record with a 1.53 ERA and 77 strikeouts in 119 innings pitched. Also a third baseman, she batted .621 with 29 extrabase hits, 44 RBI and 52 runs scored.

Bishop has maintained a B average in the classroom. In addition to donating her time as a youth softball instructor, she has volunteered locally as a peer tutor.

"She is a winner," said Newton County head coach Justin Chaney. "She always does what is best for the team. I love the way Darby carries herself on and off the field."

Bishop will begin her senior year of high school this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport.
