TRUMAN HIGH SCHOOL HIGH SCHOOL STANDOUT NAMED GATORADE® MISSOURI SOFTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CHICAGO (June 5, 2014) — In its 29th year of honoring the nation's best high school athletes, The Gatorade Company, in collaboration with USA TODAY High School Sports, today announced Paige Parker of Truman High School as its 2013-14 Gatorade Missouri Softball Player of the Year. Parker is the second Gatorade Missouri Softball Player of the Year to be chosen from Truman High School.

The award, which recognizes not only outstanding athletic excellence, but also high standards of academic achievement and exemplary character demonstrated on and off the field, distinguishes Parker as Missouri's best high school softball player. Now a finalist for the prestigious Gatorade National Softball Player of the Year award announced in June, Parker joins an elite alumni association of past state award-winners in 12 sports, including Alicia Hollowell (2000-01, Fairfield HS, Calif.), Derek Jeter (1991-92, Kalamazoo HS, Mich.), Candace Parker (2001-02, Naperville Central HS, Ill.), Abby Wambach (1997-98, Our Lady of Mercy, N.Y.), Mark Sanchez (2004-05, Mission Viejo HS, Calif.), Angela Tincher (2002-03, James River HS, Va.) and Kenzie Fowler (2006-07, Canyon del Oro HS, Ariz.).

The 5-foot-10 senior left-handed pitcher led the Patriots (28-4) to the sectional championship game this past season. Also the state's Gatorade Softball Player of the Year in 2011 and 2013, Parker compiled a 23-2 record with a 0.25 ERA in the circle, striking out 342 batters in 166 innings pitched. She also batted .600 at the plate with nine home runs and 33 RBI. Parker is a four-time First Team All-State selection and finished her prep career with state records for wins (93) and strikeouts (1,348).

Parker has maintained a 4.07 GPA in the classroom. She has volunteered locally on behalf of a literacy-outreach initiative, an animal shelter and youth softball programs.

"Parker is the best high school player that we've seen or played against," said James Hunsaker, head coach at Ruskin High. "She's nearly impossible to hit at the high school level, and she's such a powerful hitter that no one would pitch to her."

Parker has signed a National Letter of Intent to play softball on scholarship at the University of Oklahoma this fall.

The Gatorade Player of the Year program annually recognizes one winner in the District of Columbia and each of the 50 states that sanction high school football, girls volleyball, boys and girls cross country, boys and girls basketball, boys and girls soccer, baseball, softball, and boys and girls track & field, and awards one National Player of the Year in each sport. The selection process is administered by the Gatorade high school sports leadership team in partnership with USA TODAY High School Sports, which work with top sport-specific experts and a media advisory board of accomplished, veteran prep sports journalists to determine the state winners in each sport.

Three-time winner Parker joins Gatorade Missouri Softball Players of the Year Emily Crane (2011-12, Troy Buchanan High School), Jessica Damico (2009-10, Pacific), Nicole Hudson (2008-09, Webb City), Courtney Conley (2007-08, Eureka), and Kristin Nottelmann (2006-07, Rockwood Summit) among the state's list of former award winners.
